## **What is BAME?**

The University of Wolverhampton has a diverse student body. We use the term BAME to refer to students that are of, but not excluded to, Asian, Arabic, Chinese or Afro-Caribbean descent.

## **What is the BAME Attainment Gap and how can we tackle this?**

The Attainment Gap is the difference between UK white students achieving a First or 2:1 degree in comparison to UK Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic (BAME) students. The BAME attainment gap is a growing concern in universities and here, at The University of Wolverhampton, we have 25.5% gap between UK white students and UK Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic students achieving a First-Class Honours. As a Students' Union, it is important to explore the student experience and gain insight into particular challenges that students face. Therefore, we want to make sure we are supporting and empowering you to close the attainment gap and have a successful learning experience here at Wolverhampton.
