## Together we can build a Wolves community where every student feels supported, included and able to thrive from the first week to graduation.

I'm running to be your Students' Union Officer because I want the University of Wolverhampton to be a place where every student feels heard, valued and supported. Whether you're based in Wolverhampton, Walsall, Telford or studying online, whether you commute, work part-time, care for family or study around life's challenges, you deserve a university experience that works for you. Our student body is incredibly diverse and full of potential, and I believe the Students' Union should reflect that in everything it does.

During my studies, I've seen the best of Wolves: supportive staff, resilient students and a community that genuinely wants to help each other succeed. But I've also seen where things fall short. Communication can be unclear, support can be confusing to access, and too many students still feel disconnected from campus life. I'm running because I want to change that, and because I believe positive, realistic improvements are possible when students have a strong voice.

One of my priorities is improving communication across the University. Students deserve clear, timely and consistent information about their course, assessments, services and any changes that affect them. I want easier-to-navigate guidance, better updates and a standard of communication that feels fair across all schools. Alongside this, I want Wolves SU to share regular, honest "Here's what we've done for you" updates so students can see their feedback turning into action.

Supporting student wellbeing and cost of living pressures is also essential. Many of us juggle jobs, family responsibilities or long commutes, and the University should support that reality. I want more accessible wellbeing promotion, clearer signposting, and better awareness of financial help like hardship funds. I also want to improve access to commuter spaces, affordable food, quiet study areas and activities that help students feel part of a community no matter their timetable.

Wolverhampton is one of the most diverse universities in the country, and that is something to celebrate. Inclusion shouldn't be an afterthought; it should be part of everything we do. I want to work with cultural, faith and identity-based societies to plan events well in advance, support underrepresented students, and improve accessibility on campus. Whether you're from the Global Majority, part of the LGBTQ+ community, disabled, international, mature, postgraduate or otherwise underrepresented, your voice matters — and I will work to make sure it is heard.

Of course, university life goes beyond academics. Societies and student-led groups are often where friendships are built and confidence grows. If elected, I want to support societies with better resources, collaboration opportunities and recognition.

Community also means improving the practical things: housing, transport, safety and

the opportunities available in the wider area. I want to strengthen partnerships with the city, transport providers and local organisations to make everyday life easier and more affordable for students.

Most importantly, your voice should shape the University you're part of. I will work closely with Course Reps, Faculty Reps and Wolves SU staff to make sure student feedback leads to visible, real-world improvements. I'll hold open forums, run regular surveys, and be present across campuses so you can talk to me directly. You deserve a University that listens — and acts.

Here are the core changes I want to focus on:

- Clearer, earlier and more consistent communication from the University
- Better access to wellbeing and financial support
- Stronger inclusion and celebration of our diverse student communities
- More support and visibility for societies, events and student-led activity
- Improvements to housing, transport, safety and everyday student life
- A stronger platform for student voice, with real transparency on "You Said, We Did" outcomes

I'm running because I believe in a Students' Union that listens, acts and stands alongside every student. A Union that celebrates who we are, supports us when we need it, and pushes for real change where it matters.
