
SU lanyards... for everyone!

We want you to know your rights and how to act

Within the Advice and Representation Centre (ARC), there are trained advisers available providing **free**, **independent and confidential advice and support**. Some of the things they can help with are:

- Support and provide advice or guidance to students' experiencing issues with their studies and their personal circumstances
- Assist in arranging representation in meetings if required

You can also set up your own society or adopt one from our list.




