Purpose of Post

The purpose of the Course Rep role is to represent the views and academic interests of students on their course. Course Reps act as a vital link between students, academic staff, and the Students' Union, ensuring that student feedback is heard and used to enhance the quality of teaching and learning. By gathering and communicating feedback, Course Reps contribute to shaping a better educational experience for both current and future students.

Primary Responsibilities

- 1. Gather and present feedback from students on academic matters and the overall course experience.
- 2. Attend and contribute to course committee meetings to represent student views.
- 3. Work collaboratively with academic staff and the Students' Union to address issues and suggest improvements.

- 4. Communicate updates and outcomes from meetings back to students on the course.
- 5. Work with and report to the Faculty Rep, responding to any requests or communications they share on behalf of the wider student voice structure.

General Responsibilities

- 1. Maintain confidentiality of any sensitive information shared through the course of the role.
- 2. Represent the values of the Students' Union in all interactions and communications.
- 3. Respond to reasonable requests from the Faculty Rep or SU staff and contribute to the work of the Student Voice team where appropriate.

Benefits and Rewards

- 1. Develop valuable transferable skills including communication, leadership, time management, public speaking, and project coordination.
- 2. Gain experience participating in meetings and working with a range of stakeholders across the SU and university.
- 3. Receive full training, plus access to additional development opportunities such as the Course Rep Conference.
- 4. Earn a certificate and digital badge upon completing training, as well as a Course Rep lanyard for visibility and recognition.
- 5. Log volunteer hours through the SU's volunteering scheme and receive awards when you reach key milestones.
- 6. Be part of creating positive change in your course and help shape the student experience for others.
- 7. Meet and collaborate with other Course Reps and SU staff in a supportive and rewarding environment.
